## Criteria for selection to the Bachelor of Arts External Degree programme

The selection criteria have been amended according to the University Grants Commission (UGC) Circular numbers 932 and 01/2021. These guidelines will be applicable to students selected for the academic year 2017 onwards.

## 1. Required Minimum Qualifications

1.1. Students will be selected for admission by giving priority to those applicants who have gained the highest Z-score at the relevant G.C.E. Advanced Level examinations, since only a limited number of places are available.
1.2 Applicants should have passed any three subjects at one and the same attempt, in not more than three attempts at the G.C.E. Advanced Level examination conducted by the Department of Examinations Sri Lanka
1.3. Applicants with other qualifications equivalent to Sri Lanka Qualification Framework (SLQF) Level 2 (e.g., NVQ Level-5, Advanced Certificate) which fulfill the minimum admission requirements for SLQF level 3 (University Level 1) will be also considered for admission.
1.4. Other qualifications approved by the Senate may be considered, based on the recommendations of the University Admissions Committee for External Degrees.
1.5. A limited number of students will be selected for Categories 1.3 and 1.4 under special circumstances only, after the selections for Category 1.1 are completed.

## 6. The methodology utilized in selecting students

Not more than $25 \%$ of the total number of students selected for admission will be permitted to register for any one subject. Students will be allowed to select the subjects of their choice based on the above conditions regarding the subject group, and in order of priority based on the overall Z-score obtained by the student for the G.C.E. Advanced Level examination. Moreover, subject will be offered for a given intake of students only if a minimum of 20 students have registered for the subject. Further, another opportunity will be provided, if the registration could not be done in the first attempt.

## 7. Subject pre-requisites for selection

The students those who wish to study the following subjects shall fulfill the related prerequisites mentioned below

Excluding the subjects mentioned in Item 7 above which require prerequisites, students have the freedom to select the subjects of their choice, based on their interests.
