- 2. Critically evaluate the characters of Caliban and Ariel with reference to the depiction of power and resistance in *The Tempest* with detailed reference to the play
- 3. "Shakespeare's play *Othello* unfolds the fate of the individuals who fall victim to the expectations of the society." Discuss with examples from the play.
- 4. "Shakespeare's Tragedies have been characterised not just by their depictions of conflicts between a man of high degree and his destiny or as tales of 'flawed' protagonists, but make a commentary on the values of a perceptive and insightful leader." Discuss this statement with references to his play *Othello*.
- 5. How does William Shakespeare discuss the interconnected nature of love and hate through his play *Romeo and Juliet*?
- 6. Critically evaluate the portrayal of fate and free will in Romeo and Juliet by Shakespeare.
